Enhancing curriculum quality through experiential learning and academic projects and promoting quality education by introducing more value-added courses (VAC) on contemporary areas for ΔY 2023-24 for a better student learning experience and exposure to contemporary industry practices, thereby enhancing student employability.

Plans were developed in the following areas-

1. Curricular Aspects



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Plan 1.1: Implementation of Revised Curriculum

The first semester students of Batch 2023-27 of BBA Honours course have selected their respective electives from courses offered in various domains. This in line with the NEP 2020 guidelines for higher education. The revised course structure was formed based on stakeholder feedback shared in PRC meeting. This was discussed in QIC meeting on 23rd May 2023.

Plan 1.2: Curriculum Quality Enhancement

Value Added Courses were taken from the SIU course catalog. Two COIL programs have been launched in collaboration with Florida International University and Universidad Católica del Maule, Chile in the area of Marketing, HRM and Business Analytics. The titles of COIL courses are:

- Cross cultural Management Cross-cultural perspectives in depicting brand message through advertising: A reflection of culture and values
- 2. Using data Analytics to explore perceived gender differences in business professionals

2. Teaching Learning and Evaluation

Identification of slow and advance learner in various courses has been done based on their performance in first or second internal evaluation component. Necessary interventions such as remedial classes for slow learner and additional resources for advance learner are being implemented.

Plan 2.2: Implementing Pedagogical interventions for improved learning outcomes

Global Marketing Innovation Summit has been conducted by Marketing Club, PR Cell and International Cell in Collaboration with QIC. The objective was to give practical exposure to the students on the concepts such as AI and Networking. Two more workshops on



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Financial Literacy and Financial Analytics were conducted in collaboration with Finance club and SEBI. These interventions are targeted to provide application-based learning opportunities to the students.
