
Let's Make Library Fun..... ***This Spooky Season***

THE KNOCK : A Story By the American writer Fredric Brown.


Genre: Horror fiction short story.

Lockdown Treats

Halloween is scary but scary doesn't have to be necessarily gross, so sharing with you all a scary yet tasty treat "**Pumpkin Cheese Ball**"

Yield: 10 to 12 servings Preparation

Time: 20 min

Ingredients: 3 cups orange cheese puffs; 1 kg cream cheese, at room temperature; 3 cups shredded Cheddar cheese [or the regular amul one will do]; 1/4 cup chopped chives (alternatively spring onions can be used); Salt and freshly ground black pepper; 1 bell pepper with a long stem; Crackers, for serving.

Directions:

- Put the cheese puffs in a food processor and process until finely ground. Transfer to a rimmed baking sheet.
- Combine the cream cheese, Cheddar, chives, 1 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper in a large bowl and mix to combine.
- Mold the mixture into a ball, pressing the top of the ball with your hand to flatten it. With the tip of a butter knife, carve lines down the sides to resemble a pumpkin.
- Roll the cheese ball in the ground cheese puffs. Remove the entire bell pepper stem with a paring knife and put it on top of the cheeseball as the pumpkin stem. Seed and slice the bell pepper. Serve the cheeseball on a plate with crackers and slices of bell pepper.
